

Introduction:

ssiut University is one of the oldest and largest Egyptian universities, and its medical sector has earned recognition as a major healthcare provider in Upper Egypt, serving over 20 million people annually. Within this broad service, the University's women's health and youth-health initiatives play a central role in advancing reproductive and sexual health across the region.

At the heart of these efforts is the University's Women's Health Hospital (established in 2005, with 331 beds and multiple advanced obstetrics and gynecology subspecialties). This hospital offers dedicated family-planning outpatient clinics (including combined oral contraceptives, progestin-only pills, monthly injectables, implants, and copper intrauterine devices) in cooperation with the Egyptian Ministry of Health & Population. It also hosts the "Safe Woman" initiative, including a medical response unit for abused women—the first of its kind in Upper Egypt—addressing both reproductive health and gender-based violence within a holistic women's-health framework.

On the youth side, the University's Youth Health Center (YHC) offers nutrition services, early detection screenings (including chronic disease and reproductive health issues), and seminars inside and outside the campus. A study of the YHC found that while the majority of students (92.8 %) agreed that students need sexual and reproductive-health (SRH) information, only 15.1 % were aware the YHC existed, highlighting both strong demand and the need for expanded outreach.

Furthermore, the University actively engages in community awareness and screening campaigns: the College of Nursing conducts seminars to raise awareness of women's reproductive health and participated in the national "100 Million Health" initiative for early detection of breast cancer. The Women's Health Hospital has also inaugurated an advanced fetal-care unit offering interventional fetal therapy and early diagnosis of congenital anomalies—an innovative service in the region.

From a family-planning perspective, studies in the Assiut district show that the modern contraceptive prevalence was 62.8 % (though still below global targets), with intrauterine devices (IUDs), pills and implants as the most common methods. This reflects the strong emphasis that Assiut University places on family-planning services as part of its reproductive-health mandate.

In summary, Assiut University's medical sector—especially through its Women's Health Hospital and Youth Health Center—contributes significantly to improving reproductive health outcomes and expanding access to services (nutrition, early detection, family planning, education) across Upper Egypt. These efforts underline the University's role in transforming lives and supporting healthier communities.

Women's Health University Hospital services

Women's Health University Hospital is one of the largest hospitals in the Medical City of Assiut University. It is the largest university hospital in Upper Egypt, specializing in providing medical services to women in Assiut Governorate and neighboring governorates. It is visited daily by a very large number of cases in the hospital's various departments, including outpatient clinics, emergency reception, and operating departments.

As for the administration of Assiut University and the administration of university hospitals, due to the university's societal role in solving the population problem, many activities and procedures have been carried out in cooperation with the family planning sector and the Assiut Health Directorate, with the aim of increasing awareness of the importance of using various family planning methods to contribute to reducing population growth.

In this context, an initiative was launched to install an IUD during induced labor, with the aim of providing women with immediate family planning services and to continue using this method. The University Women's Health Hospital is participating in this initiative in a major way, as it is the largest hospital in terms of the number of births that take place daily. There has been a noticeable increase in the percentage of IUD installations.

The University Women's Health Hospital plays a significant role in this initiative being the largest hospital in terms of the number of daily births. A good increase in the rate of IUD insertion during cesarean sections has been observed, with the :following percentages






Significant progress has been made in IUD insertion rates during the year, starting from 1.4% and reaching 21.9%.

In 2024, the Women's Health University Hospital at Assiut University further enhanced its role as a leader in women's health in Upper Egypt. Notably, it introduced two new postgraduate diplomas for the year 2024/2025, one in Assisted Fertilization and one in Gynecologic Endoscopy — to train doctors in the latest fertility and endoscopic surgical techniques. The hospital's Advanced Fetal Care Unit expanded its services to include interventional fetal therapy and in-utero blood transfusion, reflecting its capacity to handle highly specialized cases.

Moreover, the hospital's laboratories became among the first in Egyptian universities to receive CAP accreditation — strengthening diagnostic reliability. Research initiatives also continued, including a 2024 study on violence and sexual dysfunction among infertile women served by the hospital. These developments reinforce the hospital's dual mission of high-quality clinical care and academic excellence.







Health education seminars of Women's Health University Hospital

The Women's Health University Hospital is one of the largest hospitals within the Medical City of Assiut University and the largest university hospital in Upper Egypt specializing in women's health services. It serves women from Assiut Governorate and neighboring Upper Egyptian governorates, providing comprehensive medical care through its outpatient clinics, emergency units, surgical departments, and inpatient wards.

In 2024, the hospital continued to play a leading role in providing specialized obstetric and gynecological care, including:

- Advanced reproductive health services focusing on fertility treatments and maternal care.
- Early detection and screening programs for breast, cervical, and ovarian cancers, in collaboration with the Ministry of Health and Assiut Health Directorate.
- Expansion of the Endoscopy Unit and the Early Tumor Detection Clinic, enhancing diagnostic and treatment capabilities.
- Implementation of family planning initiatives, such as the postpartum intrauterine device (IUD) insertion program, launched to improve access to immediate and effective contraception after delivery.

As part of its community outreach and awareness efforts, the hospital organized multiple health education seminars and workshops in 2024 to raise awareness about:

- Early cancer screening and prevention.
- Antenatal and postnatal care.
- Safe motherhood and family planning.

• Urinary incontinence management and gynecological health.

Through these initiatives, the hospital strengthened its mission of promoting women's health, reducing maternal and neonatal mortality, and supporting Egypt's national goals for population control and sustainable development.

Within the framework of educational seminars, 18 educational seminars were held in cooperation with rural female leaders in the Family Planning Department of the Health Directorate, aimed at raising awareness among women visiting the hospital about the importance of family planning methods.

Practical training was given on how to perform breast self-examination.

At the end of the awareness session, all participants' questions were addressed.

Forms were completed and clinical breast examinations were performed for 120

women, among whom 35 suspected cases were referred to the hospital for further

investigations and treatment initiation for confirmed cases.
